
Through many beautiful discussions, we have considered how we can celebrate our own Mums and acknowledge them for all they do for us.

We Acknowledge the traditional owners of the land on which we are located, the people of the Wiradjuri Nation and extend that Acknowledgement to Elders past and present and all Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander peoples.

## Connecting to Country

We are continuing to explore Wiradjuri language through our Acknowledgement of Country, which we share each day.

Through our own connection to country, we have been learning about our local native fauna, their Wiradjuri names and how they interact within their natural habitats.

During these connections, our Pre-Schoolers are developing a sense of empathy as we consider how we can care for our animals. Embedding this awareness encourages us to be socially responsible and model respect, care and appreciation for the natural environment.

### Our Sustainable Future

We would like to thank Rachel from *Gulgong Garlic* for her generous donation of garlic cloves and for helping us to plant our very own garlic crop at Pre-School. Our garlic is already growing well, and we look forward to harvesting it later in the year.

We are pleased to have put some of our recycled yoghurt tubs to good use, repurposing them as plant pots to raise snow pea seedlings, before transplanting them into the Pre-School garden. You can see them alongside the entry ramp.

Our worm farm is providing plenty of liquid fertiliser, and the children are fast becoming experts on how to apply this to the garden.

Thank you again for continuing to put your old stationary items into our drop-box for recycling. We are already sending off our second package! We continue to accept pens, markers, highlighters, mechanical pencils and empty correction fluid/tape.
